So far there seems to have been no media reports regarding fatalities or major injuries from firearms this rut – very good although there still were lost hunters and no doubt some injuries from accidents of other types still to come through the system. Obviously we are on the cusp of the waterfowl (mostly ducks in regular speak) season – see here [Fish and Game Info](#) , and there is plenty of messaging about safety and care in this sport too [MSC Gamebirds](#) . Tahr rut pending, so good luck for that and be careful in the mountains. So many options...so little time!

Nelson NZDA's 75th Anniversary is this year and we are looking forward to a celebratory evening coupled with our AGM in late June. As in the story below, we are seeking out our long serving members who may have earned a long service membership badge – if you have been around for a while then check those dates when you first joined and see if you qualify. More to come on this event.

While our range committee are beavering away at getting our various registration requirements underway we can see Firearms Law Reform being highlighted by the political parties as the election looms. National have produced a new policy document see here: [Nat Party Firearms Law Policy](#) , planning to review the recent reforms implemented (or about to be) by the current Government - link [Labour Justice Policy](#) , and Act are also promoting their views [ACT Firearms Policy](#) . Be politically aware and if you have concerns about the proposed massive hikes in license fees, registration and other issues, then ensure you know the different parties' policies and vote for what you wish to support.

It was good to see international shooters attending the Easter Nationals event at Packers Creek and some records broken. Also heartening are the various perspectives of successful hunts in the stories from our members - clever dogs, successful meat hunting and cracker trophies.

The recent announcements by DOC re animal control in the Queen Charlotte Sound and Pelorus areas highlights the need both for Government agencies to communicate with us early and also branches to talk to each other. We are getting better at this, and timeliness allows us to discuss what we are worried about with the agency and mitigate the impact of such programmes on our hunting experiences. Certainly, we (in conjunction with Marlborough branch) are paying close attention to the Pelorus (Bryant Range) programme on pigs and goats and will maintain comms with DOC about any next steps that may stem from deer counts this year.

Chamois hunters take note – see Coxy's Corner in this edition with information on chamois presence in numbers in Kahurangi. This is an opportunity to get a trophy and shoot a few for meat to keep numbers at reasonable levels. Contact Ian for more info.

Easter Nationals

Nelson NZDA Packers Creek Range was the venue for the 2023 National Benchrest Shooting Championships. We were honoured this year having 12 shooters from New Caledonia joining us for the weekend.

Unfortunately, our visitors were unable to enter our Nationals (that is another story) so an alternative International Match was organized as an alternative opportunity for them. We followed the normal pattern of Light Varmint Day 1, Heavy Varmint Day 2, finishing on Day 3 with Rimfire.

We always hope for nice warm quiet weather, but we got the opposite with four seasons. Good practice day but after that the weather packed a sad and we had wind and rain a plenty. However, it's the same for everyone, and with benchrest shot from under cover we just got on with it.

Saturday was the most trying with groups and aggregates somewhat larger than normal.



Hometown favourite Greg Couper lasted the distance best with a combined aggregate of .3996 followed by Christchurch's Tony Titheridge second and Auckland Branch member Peter Haxell third.

When our international friends were added in the positions did not change. However, Carina Jackson shot a **new National 100yd record group in the Factory Class of .267.**

Things improved on the Sunday and group sizes improved dramatically. Heavy Varmint was taken by Ian Owen with an overall aggregate of **.1917 including a new National 100yd aggregate record of .1774.**



Placings were Ian Owen (Dunedin) 1st, Helen Owen 2nd and Murchison's Jude Peacock 3rd.

Again, with the inclusion of our visitor's scores placings did not change things.

Finally, the Rimfire match was held on Easter Monday with a field of 25 starting including 12 from New Caledonia. For our Nationals (12 starters) Greg Couper took the title with a score of 740.30 followed by Carina Jackson and Dougal Cameron (Auckland). However, when the scores were blended together the results were somewhat different.



Anthony Tran of New Caledonia let the field home with a superb score of 749.41 from a maximum of 750.75. 2nd Christiane Richard of NCL on 741.38 and Greg's 740.30 3rd.

The weekend wrapped up with Ian Owen taking the 2 Gun award and Greg Couper the 3 Gun (LV, HV, Rimfire).

It was an event to behold and I think a while before we see another like it.



Coxy's Corner – Notes for Hunters from DOC Motueka District Office



Hi NZDA members,

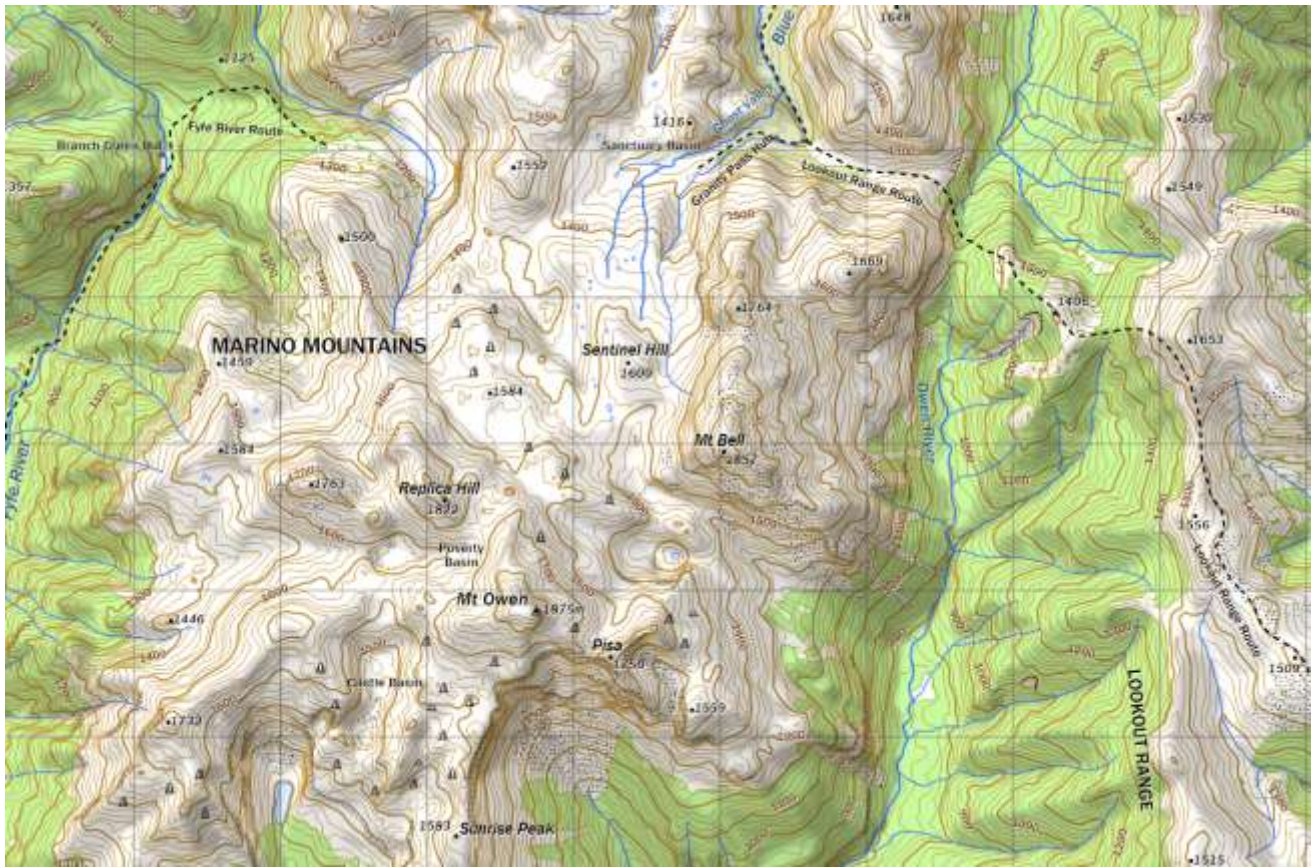
I hope all are well and have had success out in the back country during the red deer roar. The annual goat control operations in Kahurangi National Park are drawing to a close this month with some aerial control scheduled around the Cobb Valley, Little Wanganui/Kakapo valleys and Arthur Range.

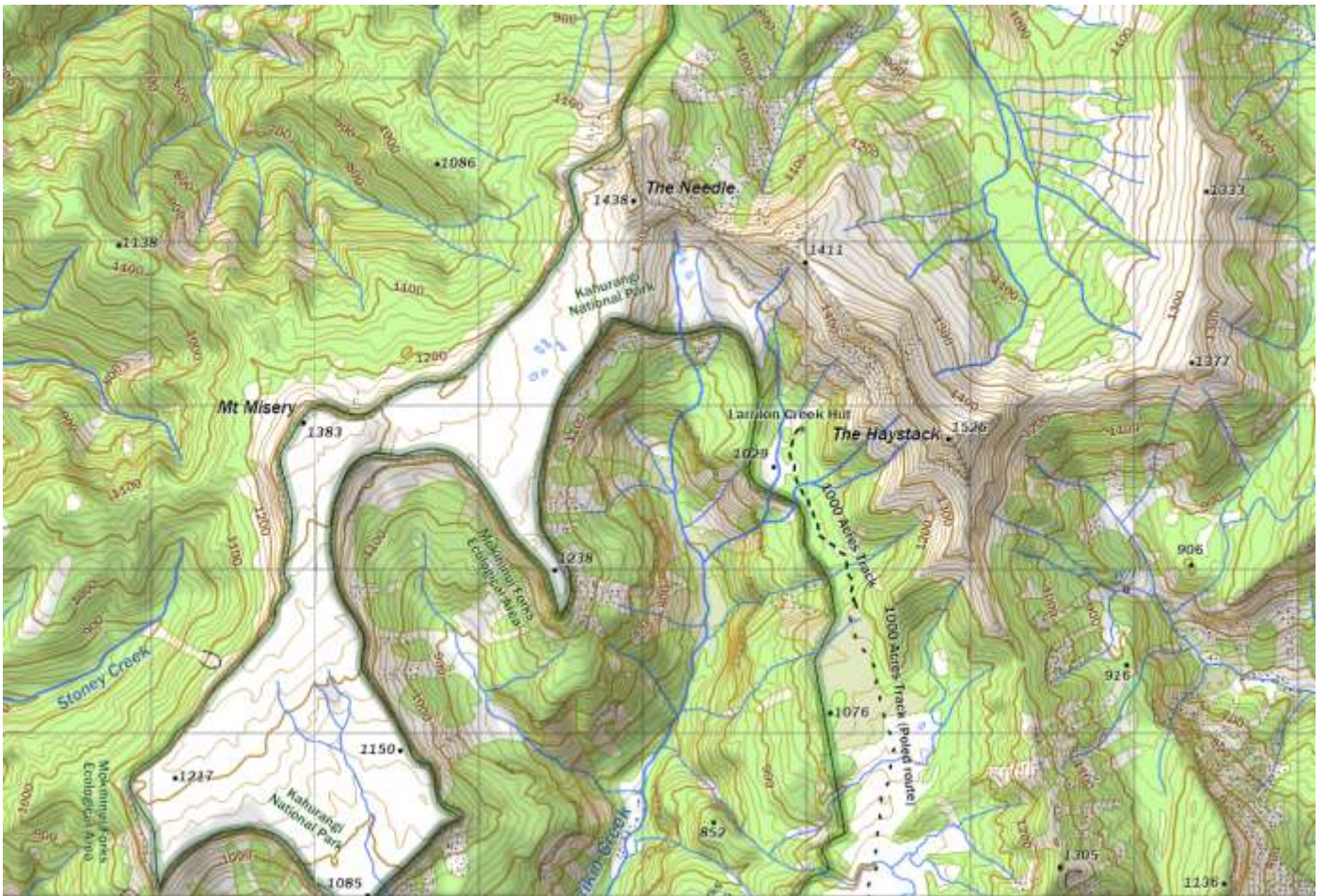
During the goat control in Kahurangi National Park this financial year a growing presence of chamois has been observed. Some small satellite populations have been reduced in flora sensitive areas as encountered. These have consisted of three family groups two on the Arthur range (one buck later shot by a recreational hunter) and one on the Bald Knob Ridge.

The Herbert range, Mt Kendall, Garibaldi ridge, Needle and Haystack (Matiri Plateau) and Mt Owen Massif have high and increasing populations that maybe compromising the goat control gains we have achieved. Mobs of twenty plus animals being observed in some locations.

With the chamois rut looming some of these locations maybe worth considering for trophy and meat harvesting.







The above maps give the general locations of the higher chamois densities. I haven't highlighted the actual locations as half the fun is hunting them out.

NELSON MARLBOROUGH FISH & GAME REPORT



MALLARD MONITORING COMPLETED: In late March staff completed mallard duck counts across the region. 60 sites are counted from Golden Bay through to Marlborough. Duck numbers were good in Marlborough, similar to last years' count, while numbers in Tasman/GB were down. Paradise duck trend counts took place earlier in the year, with high bird numbers in Golden Bay and Murchison sub-regions.

NEW WAIRAU LAGOONS ACCESS PAMPHLET: This access sheet has been refreshed, and is now available to download online from the Fish & Game website. The Lagoons are a fantastic bird hunting destination, with multiple species on the cards. The key to hunting here is to get conditions in your favour, with a good wind being key.

PARA WETLAND RESTORATION ENTERED IN MARLBOROUGH ENVIRONMENT AWARDS

Para Wetland is Nelson Marlborough's signature wetland, and one that has received considerable financial backing from the Game Bird Habitat Trust, alongside other funding avenues. The 122 hectare wetland between Tuamarina and Koromiko is the largest natural wetland in the region. Para Wetland is important because the region had lost 97 per cent of its original lowland freshwater wetlands over the past century as land was drained for farming. Fish & Game have been restoring this wetland over the past few decades, and were recently entered into the Cawthron Marlborough Environment Awards.
